## Bill and Jane Hall — Earning an “A” for Activities

Most people who have led busy, event-filled lives in their earlier years, may want to slow down a bit once they enter their retirement years, right? This is definitely not the case for Bill and Jane Hill who moved to the SCLH community in 2019. If anything, their schedules are more jam-packed than ever before, and that's saying something.

Jane was born in 1955 in Suffolk, England, and grew up with her brother, Malcolm, on a pig farm in the country. Jane's mother, 96, who still lives in England, had thirteen siblings and her father grew up with eight siblings. Jane calculates that she now has fifty first cousins. When her family gathered to celebrate weddings or holidays, they had to find a venue that could hold 200 to 250 people.

Jane's early years in Suffolk were idyllic. She had great fun driving a tractor at age 11. "It was a great childhood," she recalls. Of course, in her teens she was less thrilled (bored,

actually), so she left school at 16, graduated from a technical college at age 17, got a job as a secretary and lived on her own.

Bill hails from San Francisco and was born in 1950. He has a younger sister, Cheryl, who lives in Oregon, and an older brother, Jim,

who lives in Washington. While his mother worked, he was free to roam the city, fish on the municipal pier at age 10, participate in ROTC drill and rifle teams, and attend Boys Club meetings. He was active in the Boys Club Marching Band, playing trumpet for them and enjoying the time that the band had the honors, in 1963, of opening the Grand Parade in Disneyland where he enjoyed getting on all the rides free because he was wearing his uniform.

Graduating at age 17 from Mission High School in 1968, Bill drove a delivery truck for a year at a tobacco and candy distributor before enlisting in the Air Force. After being stationed at Lackland AFB in Texas and Lowry AFB in Colorado, Bill was sent to Thailand for a year. He worked 12-hour shifts six days a week at first, but after a while when his shifts changed, he got a chance to see more of the country. "The people were so fabulous over,






## Neighbors InDeed — You Can Beat the Heat!

We are all aware of the summer heat here in Sun City Lincoln Hills, and predictably, some days have triple digit temperatures. Several preventive steps will help keep your health, your property, your pets, and our community safe and comfortable. The information below could easily help you in this quest.

At our age, we are more vulnerable to summer heat hazards, such as dehydration, and the more dangerous heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Drinking lots of water or diluted sports drinks help you stay hydrated. Wear lighter clothing and avoid outside activities in the direct sun during the hottest times of 4 to 5 PM. Be aware that certain drinks, medications or illnesses can lower our ability to handle high temperatures. Alcohol dehydrates you and makes you more susceptible to heat exhaustion or heat stroke which can be deadly.

Pets need the same protections as their owners. Walks during the heat of the day can easily burn



their paws. Always provide them with lots of water. Even plants need special care in extreme heat. Additional amounts, or days, of watering may be needed. Some plants need more shade, or even shade-cloth, to survive. Mulch around plants helps retain water and reduces evaporation.

Several ways to reduce summer heat around our homes are: installing outside shutters, awnings, and shade systems.

## Be Prepared

Though the motto “Be Prepared” is most closely associated with the Boy and Girl Scouts it is equally important to everyone as it signifies readiness to meet any situation. With fire season in full force we should all be prepared to answer the question:

What if you have just 5 minutes to evacuate? 5 Minutes is not a long time – especially as we get older and a bit slower.

Are you Ready - Do you have a plan?

Preparation is Critical - So Here are a Few Things to Consider

Have a handy list of priority items in a couple of locations in the home. This may seem obvious but, in an emergency, we can forget even the most obvious things.

Do you have a pre-packed emergency kit? That’s great, make sure you have the following: Identification and Key Legal Documents

Wallet/ID and don’t forget cash and keys. Legal documents – a folder or something similar with the following:

- Passport
- Home Insurance information
- Health Insurance cards
- Trust or Will information – copies are good in case you can’t get to a safe deposit box.

- Medication and Medical Devices — Minimum several days of medication as well as a medication list

- CPAP machine, oxygen, canes, walkers, or other mobility devices

- Glasses and Hearing Aids – A Must!
- Communication – Staying in touch, cell phones and laptops, make sure to grab those chargers as well.

People and Pets — Don’t forget to plan for your pets.

- Have a leash, carrier, and food ready to go – and don’t forget their medications.
- Be aware of locations that will accept

pets if needed.

- Do you have neighbors who may need assistance? Reach out in advance and create a “Buddy System” – Remember this is a senior community and many of us may need help.

Other —

- Jewelry and crucial family mementos – time permitting.

Does your vehicle have enough gas?

- Good rule of thumb is to maintain at least ½ tank full.

• Keep electric vehicles fully charged.

- Do you know how to open your garage door if there is no power?

- Non-drivers should know who to call for transport.

- Know where you are going – family friend, hotel, shelter, etc.





## Bird Group

Ever wonder what bird-lovers are talking about? Maybe you just need a glossary. To be fair, most major disciplines have their own unique jargon. Lawyers have their habeas corpus; doctors have their monoclonal antibodies. Even English majors have their Petrarchan iambic pentameter. As you might expect, birders have their own esoteric vocabulary. Here are some examples. See how many you know.

**Big Year:** A challenge to see as many bird species as possible within a calendar year.

**Biophilia:** the innate human affinity for nature.

**Copse:** a thicket or grove of small trees and bushes where birds often hang out.

**Endemic:** describes a native bird restricted to a specific location.

**Fallout:** A phenomenon where large numbers of migrating birds are forced to the ground due to bad weather. A great opportunity to see birds.

**Fledge:** a bird who has developed feathers and the ability to fly.

**Invasive:** non-native species that invades a new environment and can cause harm.

**Lifer:** A bird species seen for the first time

**Nemesis:** A bird that is difficult to identify or always eludes a birder.

**Pelagic:** describes birds that spend most of their time living over the open ocean.

**Riparian:** describes birds that spend most of their time living near rivers or streams.

**Snag:** a dead or dying tree. Great habitat for woodpeckers or cavity nesters. See picture below.

**Spark Bird:** a bird that triggers a lifelong passion for birding.

Using the glossary above, you too can speak like a birder!



**A Special Reunion**

Many of you may have attended family, class, or friends reunions over the summer. My wish is that you connected with and enjoyed these gatherings that brought up memories of times past as well as possible plans for the future. My reunion this year was quite unexpected, as it came in the mail!

The package came from my brother, who is just 18 months younger than me. (We also have a younger sister, but this story is about the two of us.) Kent and I were best friends, two peas in a pod, sticking up for each other and protecting each other during our growing-up years. The package didn't even have a note or explanation, and I immediately opened it. I knew it must be something special and I would figure it out. Inside were eight envelopes, all addressed to him and sent by me. What?? The first postmark was dated August of 1957. My letter informed him that I had moved into an apartment and had purchased a pot and a cookbook. I was then 18 years old, and that was quite an accomplishment!

Another year passed and I was a wife and into the role of motherhood. A birth announcement and a letter to him with a promise to learn to bake cookies without burning down the house was included. The next letter gave him updates on some of our family; a favorite cousin getting married, a helpful auntie who gave me wise advice on taking care of a newborn, as well as updates on the comings and goings of other family members and mutual friends. By November of 1958 Kent was in the Air Force, and my letter to him was filled with pleas for him to try to get home for Christmas. Air Mail postage was eight cents. As I continued to read the letters I wrote to him, sharing my life as a young mother, I remembered those times and had a reunion in my heart with all of those people I wrote about so long ago.

Tapping into their inner superhero —

Despite possessing scant knowledge about turtles, they instantly sprung into action. They dripped droplets from a water bottle onto the turtle's face who gobbled the liquid up. It was quickly decided he needed to be relocated somewhere with water. The turtle, dubbed "Matt Damon" for reasons only they know, quickly found himself airborne in the grasp of two human hands and then with equal suddenness landing on the floor of an automobile. All this commotion invigorated Matt and he attempted to spin around and scurry under a seat.

"What if he escapes?" my wife gasped, then quickly realized that unless he had taken a crash course in manipulating doorhandles that was impossible. Within minutes they

Gone but not forgotten

For the next several weeks my wife and I visited Matt's new home and, thanks to his unsightly shell, were able to readily identify him. We took pictures to share with those who cared about him. Our son, visiting from London, was taken for a meet and greet.

He pretended to be impressed.

After a bit of research and a study of those photos, Matt became Mattie. Tail length is a determiner of gender and Mattie possessed a very demure, girlish one.

An important lesson for all of us —

A few weeks ago, we went to check on Mattie and we were thrilled to discover that romance was in the air. As one can see from the attached snapshot, Mattie clearly has a devoted male companion. She and "Ben Affleck", the obvious choice for his name, were sunbathing together on a rock we christened "The White Lotus". Shortly after this photo was taken, the happy couple dived into the water perhaps

sensing there was turtle paparazzi in the area.

This brief interaction revealed to me important lessons from Mattie and Ben. Like all of us, Mattie has endured many setbacks. there,” he recalls. He bought a motorcycle and would take a train 75 miles and then ride back to his off-base housing, while enjoying the countryside and the people.

Bill’s next tour of duty was in England where he stayed for two years. In his first year he enjoyed TDY (temporary duty assignments) visiting Spain, Italy and Sardinia. It was in England where he met his future wife, Jane, at a party. She had gotten stranded and had to ask him for a ride home. This was a bit problematic because she was raised by a father who was anti-American, referring to Americans “overpaid, oversexed and over here.” However, Jane’s assessment of Bill was quite different. “I just thought he was cute,” she says. Bill, who was always into cars (owning a 1967 Camaro when he was just 18 years old) decided to win her parents over by repairing their car. It was smooth sailing after that.

When his tour of duty in England was over, Bill asked Jane to come with him to San Francisco. He bought her a round-trip ticket

in case she’d have second thoughts, but, of course, she’s never used it. The couple lived with Bill’s mother in Morgan Hill and in January of 1974, they took her with them on a Greyhound bus to witness their marriage in Reno at the Chapel of Love. Their 50th wedding anniversary, celebrated in Costa Rica with family members hanging upside down while ziplining, was quite a contrast to their marriage in the Reno wedding chapel.

Finding work was soon a priority after the wedding. Jane received her Social Security card so she could work with Bill’s mother, then she got a job as a real estate property manager. The bulk of her career was spent working as a title and escrow operations manager.

Bill was going to use his GI bill to attend tech school but instead was hired by IBM and received IBM training in Field Engineering. After nine years, he became a specialist, retiring in 2015, completing a 41-year career at IBM.

The couple had two children. Their son, Billy, lives in San Antonio with his wife, Katie, and their two daughters. Their daughter, Ashley, lives
